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ORDINANCE NO. 36-10

AN ORDINANCE SETTING WAGE RATES FOR UMPIRES, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, STATE OF OHIO, as follows:

Section One. shall be as follows:

This Ordinance replaces any and all prior ordinances relating to compensation rates for umpires, and any and all previous and prior ordinances concerning compensation rates for umpires are hereby null and void as to the issue of compensation of umpires.

<u>Section Two.</u> This Ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance, necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Jackson, in that it is necessary to approve these rates of compensation for umpires in order that they may be paid the appropriate rate at the commencement of the ball season. Therefore, this Ordinance shall go into effect upon passage and approval by the Mayor, as provided in Ohio Revised Code Section 731.30.

<u>Section Three.</u> In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.
