ORDINANCE NO.46-12

AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING THE SALARY FOR THE SERVICE-SAFETY DIRECTOR OF THE CITY OF JACKSON TO BE \$61,800 AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

WHEREAS, the legislative authority of the City of Jackson has enacted Ordinance 223-06 creating the position of City of Jackson Service-Safety Director; and

WHEREAS, the current salary for the position is \$60,000 plus the benefits of health insurance as provided to other city employees, life insurance as provided to other city employees, and dental/vision insurance as provided to other city employees. The Service-Safety Director shall not be entitled to overtime or comp time; and

WHEREAS, this authority sees fit to increase the current salary of the Service-Safety Director by 3%, an increase of \$1,800 per year, for an annual salary of \$61,800 plus all current benefits.

WHEREAS, this matter is hereby declared to be an emergency Ordinance necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Jackson, Ohio in that it is necessary to provide the Service-Safety Director with a competitive salary and salary increases similar to those enjoyed by other employees of the City in order to ensure the position continues to be filled by qualified individuals.

WHEREAS, it is the intent of this legislative authority that, to the extent that this Ordinance is in conflict with any provision of another Ordinance, that the terms of this Ordinance be given effect in resolving the conflict.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED THAT THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO HEREBY INCREASES THE SALARY OF THE SERVICE-SAFETY DIRECTOR 3% FOR A TOTAL ANNUAL SALARY OF \$61,800 PLUS THE BENEFITS OF HEALTH INSURANCE AS PROVIDED TO OTHER CITY EMPLOYEES, LIFE INSURANCE AS PROVIDED TO OTHER CITY EMPLOYEES, AND DENTAL/VISION INSURANCE AS PROVIDED TO OTHER CITY EMPLOYEES, AND THAT THIS MATTER CONSTITUES AN EMERGENCY AND SHALL BE EFFECTIVE AT THE EARLIEST TIME PERMITTED BY LAW. THE SERVICE-SAFETY DIRECTOR SHALL NOT BE ENTITLED TO OVERTIME OR COMP TIME.

In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to adoption of this ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this Council and the deliberations of this Council and any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in a meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements, including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
