ORDINANCE NO. 54-12

AN ORDINANCE OF THE LEGISLATIVE AUTHORITY OF THE CITY OF JACKSON, OHIO AWARDED THE CONTRACT FOR VISION INSURANCE, DENTAL INSURANCE AND LIFE INSURANCE COVERAGE FOR THE PERIOD JANUARY 1, 2013 THROUGH DECEMBER 31, 2013 TO THE GUARDIAN LIFE INSURANCE CO., THROUGH FREEDOM CHOICE BENEFITS GROUP, LLC, 78 BROADWAY STREET, JACKSON, OHIO AS IT WAS THE LOWEST AND BEST RESPONSIVE PROPOSAL SUBMITTED AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The legislative authority of the City of Jackson, Ohio hereby finds that Guardian Life Insurance Co., 8800 Lyra Drive, Suite 690, Columbus, Ohio 43240, submitted the lowest responsible and responsive proposal for the contract for vision insurance, dental insurance and life insurance coverage for the time period of January 1, 2013 through December 31, 2013 for City employees as follows:

GUARDIAN LIFE INSURANCE CO. – Vision Plan

Single	\$	9.72 / month
Employee/spouse	\$	16.36 / month
Employee/children	\$	16.69 / month
Family	\$	24.41 / month

GUARDIAN LIFE INSURANCE CO. – Dental Plan

Employee only dental	\$	27.19 / month
Family dental	\$	89.25 / month

GUARDIAN LIFE INSURANCE CO. – Life Insurance

Life insurance for 93 employees		
for 73 employees at a \$20,000 policy	\$	5.00 per employee/month
for 20 employees at a \$40,000 policy	\$	9.60 per employee/month

The above policies of insurance shall be administered through Freedom Choice Benefits Group, LLC, 78 Broadway Street, Jackson, Ohio 45640.


Section 2. The Mayor and/or the Service Director is hereby authorized and directed to execute the contract for insurance according to the terms of the proposal submitted by Guardian Life Insurance Co. and Freedom Choice Benefits Group, LLC.

Section 3. This matter is hereby declared to be an emergency necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health or safety of the City of Jackson, Ohio in order to maintain continuous insurance coverage as required by contract with the bargaining agreements and contracts with the City employees.

Section 4. In the event this Ordinance receives a majority vote for passage but fails to receive the required number of votes to pass as an emergency, then this Ordinance shall be deemed to have passed but with no emergency clause, and shall take effect at the earliest time permitted by law.

It is hereby found and determined that all formal acts of this council concerning and relating to adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of this council and that the deliberations of the council and any of its committees resulted in such formal action, wherein meeting open to the public, in compliance with all legal requirements including Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.
